2. TERMS The terms of sale are payment on the day by coin of the realm, certified cheque, bankers' draft or Credit/Debit Card (see General Conditions of Sale). Any animals in the sale premises which are sold by private treaty after the auction are subject to the full commission on the price realised and all such transactions must be passed through the auctioneers.

- 3 MARKET LOCATION** A location map of Chelford is printed at the back of this catalogue. The market lies adjacent to the A537 Knutsford – Macclesfield road, and is best approached from the motorway network via junctions 18 or 19 off the M6. Alternatively, those travelling from the North may find it more convenient to use the new M60 Manchester orbital route, and to follow the A34 south through Wilmslow and Alderley Edge, turning right on the A537 at Monks Heath traffic lights.
By rail, travel from Crewe or Manchester Piccadilly on the local service, which stops at Chelford Station adjoining the Centre. By air, the Centre lies less than 10 miles from Manchester Airport, from where transport can be arranged upon request.
- 4 REFRESHMENTS** Hot and cold refreshments will be available on the sale day in the Farmers Choice restaurant.
- 5 SALE CONDITIONS** The auction sale rules of the National Beef Association as amended by the British Blue Cattle Society (BBBCS) as referred to herein are applicable as stated. Other stock are sold under the National Conditions of Sale recommended for use in markets by the Livestock Auctioneers' Association (LAA), except where those conditions are inconsistent with any conditions referred to or stated herein, or such other conditions as may be announced prior to the fall of the hammer.
Intending purchasers should not bid for, or buy, any lot or lots unless they are familiar with all conditions of sale, and agree to be bound by them. In the event of any dispute, the auctioneers reserve the right to refer the matter to an independent arbitrator appointed by the LAA, whose decision shall be final and binding on all parties.

Important:

These guarantees contain provision by way of exclusion and limitation of liability in favour of the Vendor and the Auctioneers. ***The attention of Sellers and Buyers is particularly drawn to a change in the bull breeding warranty (trial period) Clause 4.2. You are strongly recommended to consult the Breeding Warranties beforehand.***

The sale is conducted under the General Conditions of Sale, which are exhibited in the Market Office and in accordance with the Regulations approved by The Highland Cattle Society.

All Bulls, Heifers and Calves are accepted for entry under the Regulations pertaining to the Sale of Pedigree Highland Cattle as drawn up by the Society.

1. All animals entered for the Sale must be pedigree and registered or accepted for registration by The Highland Cattle Society.
2. All animals entered for Sale should be bona fide property of the Vendor and must be bona fide exposed for sale at the Sale. Animals not bred by the Exhibitor must be registered in their name with the Society. No substitution of animals entered in this Catalogue will be permitted.

Warning

3. All Highlanders born before 1st January, 1998 entered for sale must be tattooed in the right ear (or left ear where specially mentioned in the catalogue) with a Herd mark (consisting of three letters), a year letter, and a number. These tattoo marks and the registration number of the animal will be printed in the Catalogue. Animals not properly or legibly identified will be disqualified from the sale.

Purchasers must verify tattoo marks and official identification marks before taking delivery of their purchases and if any earmarking or identification irregularity is discovered, the animal in question may be rejected. Sellers must stand by their animals until the identity has been checked.

4. Immediately after the purchase is declared the risk of the animal shall be exclusively with the Purchaser.
5. Unaltered cattle are not permitted in the Show, but are permitted for Sale only.

Health & Safety

All bulls must be rung or snitched.

Health Status

Health testing – **all cattle lose their accreditation status once they have entered the market premises.** To regain status without affecting other cattle of higher status the must

be isolated and retested either at the buyer's premises or the seller's premises (if unsold). To minimise the risk of cross infection on the market premises, cattle for sale from a fold where all the animals are tested on a whole herd basis are segregated from animal with no health status. Animals tested on an individual basis are segregated from other animals of higher status and no status, **if this is practicable**, otherwise they are penned with animals of no health status.

Animals consigned for an official sale under the auspices of the Society who have failed any test, whether as part of a whole herd basis or as individuals, should be advised to the office of the Society, and should not be presented for sale.

Enzootic Bovine Leukosis (EBL). The UK is officially free of EBL.
Infectious Bovine Rhinotracheitis (IBR) attested cattle.
Leptospira Hardjo (ELITE) attested cattle.
Bovine Viral Diarrhoea (BVD) attested cattle.
Johne's Disease (Paratuberculosis) attested cattle.

Cattle tested for any of these diseases either on a whole herd basis or as individuals are described approximately in the Index of Seller or in the animal note section in this catalogue.

In view of the complexity of the health regulations, buyers should seek to establish the current health status of any animal whose purchase is being considered by prior consultation with the seller.

Vendors must ensure that the correct health documentation accompanies each animal upon arrival at the mart, otherwise their cattle will be sold at the end of the sale.

Market staff will be briefed to be prepared for cattle of different status but all consigners should ensure that they have photocopied certificates to show to market staff on arrival as proof of health status.

The particulars shown in the catalogue are furnished by the Vendors and are believed to be correct, but the Society accepts no responsibility for any mistake or error therein. Vendors must intimate before or at the time of the sale any mistake or misprint in their entry.

The Society does not accept any responsibility for the health status of animals entered in the catalogue.

Sellers consign animals to the market premises entirely at their own risk.

Calves sold at foot

Bull calves at foot must be properly identified and eligible for registration in the Herd Book. Heifer calves at foot must be registered in the Herd Book.

Highland Cattle Society Rules Relating to Appendix Females

Females of unknown pedigree, but accepted as being of true Highland type, are eligible for entry in Appendix B of the grading up register of the Highland Cattle Herd Book.

Only female progeny out of Appendix females, and by registered Highland bulls, are eligible for entry in the Herd Book: female calves of Appendix B cows into Appendix A of the

grading up register, and female calves of Appendix A cows into the Herd Book proper. No male progeny out of Appendix females can be accepted for entry in the Herd Book.

Highland Cattle accepted for entry into the grading up register are identified by the addition of the suffix 'B' or 'A' to the ear tattoo denoting the appropriate appendix.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ACCOUNTS

The Accounts Office is situated within the Auctioneers Offices.

SETTLEMENT

Settlement in full for all stock purchased is due immediately at the close of the sale and before the stock is removed from the pens.

ARRIVAL OF STOCK

All cattle must be delivered to the sale premises by 8.00 am on the day of the Show & sale. Exhibitors are, however, able to deliver their animals the day previous, in which case they may be delivered to the sale premises after 12 noon.

FODDER

Straw for bedding will be provided free of charge but vendors must provide their own feeding stuffs, utensils, grooming equipment etc.

All vendors are reminded they are responsible for the feeding and watering of their animals whilst upon the Market premises. Additional feed can be purchased from the Auctioneers by prior notification.

CLEARANCE OF STOCK

All stock should be removed from Chelford by 6.00pm on Saturday 24th April 2010. Any prospective purchasers who have not made transport arrangements should speak to the Auctioneers **PRIOR** to the sale. The Auctioneers accept no responsibility for stock left on their premises. No animal may leave the market without first being checked by the market staff.

HALTERS

All cattle entered for the Show must be provided with a serviceable halter which will become the property of the purchaser.

FODDER

Vendors must provide their own fodder, feed stuffs, drinking utensils and grooming equipment. Adequate bedding and water facilities will be available. Additional bedding and/or fodder can be supplied by the arrangement with the Auctioneers at an agreed cost.

NUMBERING

All animals will be numbered ON ARRIVAL at the sale premises and must remain numbered throughout the show and sale. All stock will be numbered and penned and sold in catalogue order, unless any alteration is authorised by the Auctioneers.

It is the responsibility of the vendor to ensure they are present in the pens when the market staff are numbering the animals.

SUBSTITUTES

No substitutes will be allowed.

RESERVES

Vendors shall have the right to fix a reserve price for any or all of their entries. Such reserve prices must be notified to the Auctioneers in writing on the day of the sale at least thirty minutes before the commencement of the sale. Levy at 5% will be charged on the difference between the average sale price for the class of stock and the price at which any animal in that class is withdrawn from sale. Animals, which fail to reach the reserve price fixed by the vendor, may be sold by private treaty after the auction. Full commission and levy will be charged on all such transactions, which must pass through the Auctioneers.

Buyer's Declaration

It is the responsibility of the purchaser on collection of the Cattle Passports for the animals he has purchased to complete a Declaration Form. The eartags must be checked against each Cattle Passport before signing the form and returning it to the Society office.

Highland Cattle Pedigrees

Certificates of Pedigree and Ownership will not be issued for animals purchased at this sale without a signed Declaration Form.

Buyers are reminded to retain the Sale Catalogue. The short pedigrees of cattle offered for sale have been verified by the Society and are adequate for most practical purposes.

Change of Ownership

Change of ownership at official Society sales is automatically recorded only on receipt of a Buyer's Declaration Form.

DOCUMENTATION

Purchasers are reminded that all documents relating to the animal/s purchased must be uplifted from the market prior to leaving. The market cannot accept any responsibility for documents which may have to be posted out from the market.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: TRANSPORT OF LIVESTOCK
